The Capital Region Housing Collaborative Continuum of Care (CRHC-CoC) Announces A Funding Opportunity for FY23-24 HUD ESG & MSHDA ESG grant activities for Ingham County

The HUD Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) provides funding to public and non-profit agencies for homeless emergency shelter, both operations and essential services related to operating shelters, street outreach to people experiencing unsheltered homelessness, and homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing assistance. For FY23-24, these two applications are merged into ONE application for both City and MSHDA ESG funding for the Ingham County CoC. If applying for funds from both sources, only one application and two budgets will be required, one for each entity. The application and budget documents will be available on the CRHC website https://capitalregionhousing.org and the City of Lansing website at www.lansingmi.gov by 4/03/23.

Applications will be due April 21st by Noon to the CRHC Coordinator at **glhrncoordinator@gmail.com** Please see the Application timeline posted on the CRHC website for all relevant deadlines.

Program activities and allocation amounts for the <u>City</u> Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG) for the period of July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024 are below. [Approved by the CoC Board on 3/28/23.)

Street Outreach \$5,448 (3%)

Homeless Prevention – Legal mediation, and Financial Assistance, Rapid Rehousing are eligible components. \$79,901 (44%)

Shelter Operations \$78,085 (43%)

Total Available for Application: \$163,434

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Funds to support the CoC administration/data systems are **currently designated** by the Federal Agency on Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the CoC Board to the City of Lansing for Administration at \$12,711 (7%) (ESG Grant recipient) and to Haven House for the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) \$5,448 (3%).

Total City ESG funds - \$181,593

Applicants for MSHDA ESG funds must also complete the ESG application and complete the MSHDA budget form. MSHDA Program Activities and Allocations for the period of October 1, 2023 through September 30, 2024 are *estimated below* based on CoC Board approval on 3/28/23. (Allocations subject to change upon release of the MSHDA NOFO scheduled for April/May, to be reviewed and finalized by the CoC Board.)

Shelter Essential Services/Operations

Shelter Essential Services/Operations - \$153,020 (29%)

Prevention - \$94,597 (18%)

Rapid Rehousing - \$198,208 (37%) = \$292,805 (55%)*

Funds to designated agencies to administer the HMIS & Administration - Homeless Management Information System - \$26,618 (5%) and administration - \$37,266 (7%) Total Estimated MSHDA allocation - \$532,372

*Per MSHDA, a minimum of 40% of the allocation is designated to the HARA or \$212,949 based on the estimated allocation above.
